The cost of parking is £15.00 per 24-hour stay in our own off-site car park. On arrival at the Hilton Nottingham, our concierge team will take care of your luggage and park your car for you.



the turning point

The redevelopment of Trinity Square is closely linked to the £11.7 Government funded Turning Point road scheme which transformed Milton Street and part of Parliament Street into a pedestrian friendly area with access for essential traffic only. Traffic levels in the area, excluding public transport, have reduced by 90% since the introduction of these traffic changes.

The Turning Point scheme is on schedule to be complete by the end of 2006. Before the scheme can be completed we will be installing many more pedestrian improvements on Milton Street and on Upper and Lower Parliament Street including; widening pavements, laying high quality paving and installing more crossing points as well as installing new lighting and planting new trees. We will complete the scheme by resurfacing Milton Street and Parliament Street.

Trinity Square is being transformed into an exciting new area for shopping, restaurants, pavement cafes, private accommodation and a new council owned car park.

Work is already underway to construct the first of the two buildings on the site of the former Birkbeck House and now work to demolish the current Trinity Square car park will start. This means that Trinity Square car park will be closed from Thursday 12th January.



The new City Council car park will have more dedicated spaces for blue badge holders and an equal number of general spaces compared to Trinity Square. There will also be cycle lockers and a cycle cage facility and public toilets too. It is expected to open by the end of 2006 as part the Birkbeck House development.

In the meantime there are plenty of other places you can park nearby including;

Euro car park on Upper Parliament Street is a 24 hour multi-storey car park which has 220 spaces.

Curzon Street pay and display car park is open from 7am to 7pm (Mon to Sat) and has 112 spaces.

The new Metro car park on Union Road off Huntingdon Street is a 24 hour multi-storey car park which has 250 spaces.

Talbot Street Multi-storey car park is a 24 hour car park which has 444 spaces.

Crowne Plaza Hotel car park (formerly the Royal Moat House Hotel) is a 24 hour multi-storey car park. The entrance is on Hanley Street off Wollaton Street. It has 640 spaces.

Victoria Centre underground car park has entrances on Glasshouse Street and York Street. It is open from 6.30am until 8pm daily and has 1606 spaces.

Victoria Centre Multi-storey car park is open 24 hours a day and its entrance is on Woodborough Road. It has 1011 spaces.

Other facilities There are also plenty of other car parks around the city centre (just follow the 'P' for parking road signs) and over 1400 on-street pay and display parking spaces too. In addition there are 4,000 spaces at two bus based Park & Ride sites and five tram park and ride sites.
